The BLBCA has a BOD which consists of 7 people, including one director from the general public. Our annual general meeting is normally held in the spring at Thompson Rivers University in Kamloops.

Following are some of the main benefits of joining the Association:

- Provides a unified voice that can deliver concerns, requests and suggestions to the government of BC. We are aligned with a number of other like-minded, adventure tourism sectors.
- > Commercial General Liability insurance for all full members in good standing. The possibility of Association wide property insurance is being explored.
- ➤ Joint marketing and advertising. We have worked with Destination BC and its predecessors for over 10 years and have access of up to \$250,000.00 annually in joint marketing funds. We are entering year 6 of that program.
- A sense of community with people in the same industry. That sense has seen substantial growth in the last 6 years. Sharing of ideas and support amongst association members.
- ➤ A unified body, strength in numbers. (In 2007, we completed an independent socioeconomic survey that allowed us to quantify exactly who we are and how important this sector is to the rural BC tourism industry). A second survey is just about to be launched.
